Remembering John Otto

[Editor's Note: While there has been much already in the local media on the passing of Buffalo radio legend John Otto, this reminiscence by a BARRA member who knew and worked with him seemed appropriate.]

I had the pleasure of working with John at WGR for four years in the mid seventies. I was working weekends on sister station WGRQ at the time and used to fill in as John's engineer (today they're called producers or board operators) for Extension 55. There was no call screener, John screened calls himself during commercial or news breaks and put them on hold. John pioneered the format of talk radio way back in the

John was always a true gentleman. Quick-witted and with his own unique style, inflection and command of the English language. John had a dry sense of humor and an infectious laugh. What John may have lacked in formal education, he more than made up for with his extensive reading. He would literally have stacks of reference material in the studio each night.

I have fond memories of my time working with John. My favorite story is one time WGR had hired a new engineer. This guy walked around with a cup of coffee, but often didn't do much else. John had complained of a problem with his headphones and filed the appropriate report with the engineering department. Because of the tape delay (we used two reel to reel machines to produce a seven second delay so obscenities could be deleted from the air) good headphones were essential to his program. This new engineer returned the report to John with two Q-tips taped to it, implying John should clean the @#\$% out of his ears. John was visibly angered and expressed his displeasure to me in no uncertain terms as only he could do. I asked if I might look at the headphones and John agreed. Five minutes and a couple of dabs of solder later, the headphones were good as new. John never forgot that, and I had a friend for life.

It was a treat to run his board. He was a very animated character, continually making gestures to the caller on the

John Otto Remembered, continued from page 1 phone. Back then he was flicking his Bic to light another "More" cigarette. I remembered the fun we had when John hosted election night coverage. The guest analyst was former Amherst supervisor (and Buffalo radio legend) Jack Sharpe. The two of them had the staff in stitches, as they took turns taking shots at Don Dussias and the others when they called in.

The last time I spoke to John was in May of 1998 when he was inducted into the Buffalo Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame. John was in ill health at the time, carrying his oxygen tanks with him. His acceptance speech was vintage self-deprecating Otto. As he made his way from the stage, he saw me sitting there. His eyes lit up and he came over. I gave him a big hug and the kudos he had earned. He was truly overwhelmed that so many of his friends had gathered to honor him. I have a collection of his jingles and several classic John Otto bloopers that I will always cherish.

So let us remember our friend, John Otto, and recall all he has given us over the years, as he has hangs up on Extension 55 for one last time. We're all going to miss him.

New Repeater User's Guide

As has been reported in the pages of *The Link* over the past year or so, Gil Boelke, W2EUP, has been working on revising and revamping the code which drives the microcomputer controller at the Cole Road site, which in turn drives all of the RF equipment at the site, including the links to other repeaters like WA2HKS 444, TFMCS, WB2JQK 10 meters and others to come.

The micro was designed and built by BARRA members back in 1983 -- 17 years ago!!! While linking controllers with password control schemes similar to BARRA's exist today, for many, many years BARRA's was the only one out there because it was home-grown -- a testament to the technical prowess of the club.

Some time ago, the Technical Committee saw the need to re-work the linking scheme implemented by the controller, along with other more esoteric software modifications. The result of this was a major overhaul of the programming code, most if not all of which was done by Gil. Gil has dubbed the new software "Links 98."

In the next two issues of *The Link*, there will be a special supplement included in the copies sent to members which outline the terminology, codes and examples necessary for utilizing the controller to its full potential when linking to other repeaters.

There are a total of eight pages to the supplement, and the first four appear with this issue. Save these supplement pages and add them to the final four which will be included with next month's issue.
