NASA plans to send into outer space an observatory designed to search for new planets. It will go up in the year 2002. They are looking to the public for a name; presently it is called "Space Infrared Telescope Facility." I found this information in the "Space Chronicle" at the HoustonChronicle.com. It could be fun to invent the name for this vehicle. Pass the word around on this subject, clubs, schools etc. Contact NASA for more information on the topic (SIRTF).

Another topic up this alley is the ARISS, Amateur Radio International Space Station Program, sponsored by ARRL, NASA, and American Satellite Corporation (AMSAT.) The first ham rig orbited with Owen K. Garriott in 1983 on the Columbia. He was an amateur radio operator. Since then over 24 ARISS operations have succeeded with ham radio operators. If your school is interested in applying for a QSO with the International Space Station then contact www.arrl.org/sarex/sarexap.html.

The first QSO with the ISS took place 12/21/2000 with the Burbank Illinois School. Fourteen students and their teachers all participated in the contacts and to say the least it was exciting! What a thrill it must have been to hear Commander Bill Shepard from outer space!






