RTTY-Like Feed Available on the Internet

Looking for an audio mark/space feed to fine tune a demodulator, terminal unit, software package? The Teletype enthusiasts at the http://www.rtty.com web site have for the last few years been providing audio streams of 60 WPM 5-level Baudot code.



There are two primary feeds. Point your Internet media device (Windows Media Player, RealPlayer, iPod, iPad, Internet radio, etc.) to one of these streams:

ITTY -- Internet Teletype. General news bulletins broadcasted 24/7. http://209.180.212.65:8000/listen.pls

Internet Teletype News Channel. National news, politics, military and sports, also broadcasted 24/7.

These feeds are especially fun if you are like your editor and still have a mechanical teleprinter (or two ... or more) and a terminal unit. No more waiting for the right propagation or a RTTY contest to have some traffic to exercise your machines ... dial this up any time.

The holiday season is also known to have sessions where the RTTY art tapes of old are transmitted.




