From the Archives

Excerpted from Board of Directors meeting report in The Link of February 1973

Gil [W2EUP] reported on the WNY and Ontario [repeater] Council Meeting: area representatives attending were Gil Boelke, John Latta and Hugh Aikenhead for BARRA, Dennis Griffin and Barry Garratt for W2OY, Dick Ziehl for W2RUI and Bob WA2YQO for WA2UWK. Bart Bridge is chairman of the council's frequency allocation committee. Lloyd Kubis VE3ERQ was elected president and VE3ATI Secretary/Treasurer for 1973.

A list of area repeaters was distributed, an SASE to W2PVL will get you a copy. Our application for frequencies of 146.40/147.00 will be filled when Oshawa moves in April. At present WB2ZWP will use these frequencies but future plans are: allocation of 6.40/7.00 to WB2UYO and ZWP will shift to 146.43/147.03 if arrangements can be made. Gil proposed that the council consider the NERA plan for frequency division due to unavailability of more frequencies. This plan uses standard 600 kHz spacing for repeater input/output with half the assignment inputting 146.01 to 146.40 and output on 146.61 to 147.00, the other half input 147.97 to 147.63 and output on 147.37 to 147.03 (26 ch.) Another plan being where the in-out spacing is only one MHz and station separation 20 kHz (50 ch.) A study is to be made of unification of touch-tone number systems in use on Rptr. control in this area.

The next meeting is scheduled for May 5th, Virgil Smith, WA2TTQ, has volunteered services to represent us at the Hamburg Hamfest Committee meetings, at least one other member is needed.

RAWNY is promoting a visit in this area by Ed Tilton, the editor of the VHF column in *QST* sometime before the Rochester Hamfest May 12th. It is anticipated he will speak in Buffalo on May 10. We have been asked to send two Directors to attend a meeting with Ted Podd on February 8th.

As a youngster he was fascinated with electronics. His mother directed his talents, and put him into a 4H Club radio class. He was about fifteen, and a sophomore in



high school and was first licensed as WN2ISG in 1973. In a year he became an advanced licensee.

Remember the Galaxy 500? Paul operated one and did CW. Alaska was a first contact. He had his shack in his bedroom, and operated a transceiver on his dresser. He also had a five element antenna for 10 through 40 meters. He made a wire beam, 40 feet by 70 feet. His tower, made up by two by fours, was in the trees, and the antenna was held up by ropes. He could not believe his parents permitted this construction, but they did! His Elmer was Lew Visco, a family member at school. Other radio operators he knew were in an Explorer Post. He settled on SSB for most of his radio time.

RACES and ARES became his focus in amateur radio. If you recall from his presentation at RAWNY then you heard him speak about his excursion to Canton, Ohio where he assists in the grand parade at the Football Hall of Fame. He also enjoys camping with his family. He operates his radio, and assembles an antenna using the rock and string method or bow and arrow. Paul Bruski plays an important part in amateur radio. From the Archives

In the October 1983 BARRA *Link* was the ad below for the GLB PK1 Packet Radio Controller, for the then-new packet mode, and of course designed and offered by BARRA's own Gil, W2EUP, aka GLB Electronics. It is probably safe to assume that a number of BARRA members still today have a PK1 among their equipment. Note that the PK1 advertised below didn't support the AX.25 protocol yet! Anovel function of the PK1 and later PK1L packet TNCs was support for Baudot TTY machines, allowing hams operating RTTY the ability to get in on packet without having to buy a computer or electronic "dumb" terminal.


Installation is simple. You need 12-volts DC and connections to four points in your transceiver (receiver audio, transmitter audio, push-to-talk and squelch). If you have a computer with an RS232 jack, just hook up an adaptor cable. If you plan to use an RTTY machine you'll have to add a few parts to convert logic levels and to filter out some of the mechanical contact "bounce". (We supply a schematic, or an adaptor board).

Used with a computer you can operate with a simple "dumb" terminal program, or write a more elaborate one to send and receive data from/to disk, printer, etc. The Model PK1 is ROM programmable and can be set up for any of the existing protocols using the SDLC standard for data transmission and BELL 202 tones.

Initial deliveries of the PK1 are programmed for the "Vancouver" protocol at 1200 baud (AX.25 to be offered soon and others to be supported as they become popular.)

Dimensions: 4.5 x 10 inches; 1" vertical clearance Power requirement: + 12 VDC, approx. 200 ma.

Standard equipment includes 2K of RAM. Model PK1, wired & tested - \$149.95
