Proposed Change in BARRA General Meeting Schedule

The BARRA board of directors has proposed a change in the general meeting schedule. The discussion started with how the turnout for the January Technical Committee report was down a bit due to the inclement weather that night, something that happens often for the January meeting. Your editor vividly recalls having to call off the January meeting one year when he was president because the conditions were REALLY bad that night!

The current "crazy" meeting schedule was born out of reducing the number of meetings for several reasons: cutting expenses on the newsletter, which isn't published in the "off" months (this was before e-mail distribution of the newsletter), declining meeting attendance, and the difficulty in securing adequate programs for all the general meetings.

What is being proposed is moving the meetings closer to a more or less every-other-month schedule: September (proposed new Technical Committee Report month), October (our annual corporation meeting and election of board directors), December (the holiday party), February (The Auction), April, June and July (The Mobile Clinic and Picnic). If you are unable to join a DX expedition then one alternative may involve an Internet adventure. Have you ever had a QSO with a station in Antarctica? Whether you have, or have not, it will be helpful to start with the home page of the "Worldwide Antarctic Program." http://www.waponline.it/Home/tabid/58/default.aspx It will let you observe Antarctic station logs, bulletins, videos, churches, special links, and live web cams. For example, I used "Ham's Link" and verified a QSO between AY8XW and DX specialist Dr. Small, KM2L. He told me over the phone that the QSO "was on 11/23/02 on 20 meters." Other interesting and valuable parts on this site includes Antarctic history, stories about aviation, ships, radio, and exploration. There is a very good documentary about Admiral Richard E. Byrd's first South Pole flight in 1928, two years after he flew over the North Pole in 1926. Please see http://www.waponline.it/default.aspx?tabid=132

We can research station activity, Internet schedules, news, and web cam broadcasts. One of the links is SYOWA Web cam at http://www.nipr.ac.jp/~webcam Fixed cams in this polar region are subject to adjustments depending upon solar positions. Sunrise and sunset takes months at a time. Attendants will point a cam toward the snow if the sun is rising or setting at the horizon. This procedure is done to avoid long periods of glare.

Since Admiral Byrd's settlement of "Little America" in 1928, radio, telephone, and computers have made Internet adventures possible. We can instantly learn from Arnewsline that expedition 3YOE recently had an emergency: a crew member was bitten by an elephant seal, or that 3YOE has changed split frequency to 14.260 MHz due to European QRM.

It is amazing that telecommunication culture has been able to synchronize global communications in many modes. It is only eighty years since Admiral Byrd's explorations. Apparently the door to exploration is open, and urbanization has made it possible to view closely the coldest continent on earth.




