I found a title in the ARRL periodical index by KA2WFT, Doug Alderdice, BARRA's VP and newsletter editor. In *QST*, September 1985, pg. 65 Correspondence, Doug wrote "Novices and Elmers." Intrigued, I called Doug for an interview. In his letter, he agreed with the author of an article in an earlier *QST* who wrote about Elmers being key to get-



ting new hams started, citing his own experience with Elmers. Doug's Elmer in amateur radio was his best friend and his father. He met them while attending Susquenhenna University in Pennsylvania. Doug started with a Drake receiver that he bought at a hamfest that his Elmers took him to and a Heathkit DX-40 that he borrowed from them.

The start of my ham radio hobby is a good memory. Year after year, the challenges in amateur radio generate communication, meetings, research, field trips, new ideas and repairs. The FCC and the ARRL negotiate the changes. There have been many changes in the past few years! Doug Alderdice's letter in the September 1985 *QST* is a stimulus to exchange ideas about our own experience. Connect with yourself, observe the logs, field trips, expeditions, magazines, equipment, and tests. Perhaps you will reach a new plateau.




