Hobby Highlights

On December 19, 2006 the FCC stated that Morse code is no longer a requirement for amateur radio licenses. I learned that this could happen in this country when I saw Bill Edgar N3LLR, Atlantic Division Director, speak at the STARS club in April 2006. Along with this change, no QSO logs, and license revisions, the quarter



century gang has seen a new school develop for amateur radio operation. Our theory and future remain bright. Opinion varies about what has happened about Morse Code and license hierarchy.

My 2006 "Hobby Highlight" shows that these changes have had little impact for operators. I wrote about logging QSOs, fund raising, Software Defined Radio, ARRL publications, Division policies, club history, propagation, novel experiments, radio merit badges in the Boy Scouts, and "ARRL Club News." The year was full of fun and excitement. Our hobby would suffer if we lost operating frequencies for different modes! Our future for operating will not only be in the shack. A strong ARRL lobby must be in the House.

QST used to have quite a few advertisements about our military using radio equipment. The articles focused on tube technology and solid state. Today, space stations with licensed astronauts circles the globe. The new generation of hams need not know Morse Code or five license classes: novice, technician, general, advanced, and extra class. The amateur radio operator of today should do what he or she can to advance the old art of Morse code. Like volunteer examiners, I think code classes for operators will be a grass root movement, however skills will not be subject to a test or a license. The proficiency of an operator in CW mode on the air will either be machine code or individual expertise. 73 de KG2OR, Richard Sellers.

My palms were sweating as I sat in the Federal Building in 1972 to take my novice exam. Part of the testing was the ability to send and receive International Morse Code at what seemed the lightening speed of 5 words per minute – but I passed and was given the call, WN2QYA. I still have my first QSL card from that original contact in Florida.

Shortly thereafter, I passed the General, and later, the Advanced class at the Rochester Hamfest. This meant not only more complex theory, but the skill to copy code at 13 wpm. In both cases, I passed, and the sense of accomplishment was second to none.

I read today through the cyber ARRL newsletter that the code requirement will soon be ended for all classes of licenses. What a sad commentary, in my opinion.

Be that as it may, yes, we are living in the age of solid computer QSOs to anyone with an Internet connection and the equipment; and yes, I know Yaesu, Kenwood, Icom, 'et al' want to sell their wares, but what about the "art" of our scientific hobby? What about the deaf person who uses a flashing light to capture his CW QSOs? What about the satisfaction of accomplishment in building a simple transmitter that actually works and the semblance of understanding why it does?

Maybe I'm just an old fuddy-duddy, but I believe we have lost something most precious. I would invite and deeply encourage all new hams to learn the international Morse code. Why would you want to deny yourself the most effective way to communicate though most any interference, and, if and when, the system collapses?




