Goodsearch Yields Good Rewards for BARRA

BARRA treasurer Ed Swan, W2EAS, reports that we have received a check from the Goodsearch Internet search engine for \$110.45!! This is for searches and



online purchases conducted through Goodsearch with BARRA designated as the non-profit organization to benefit.

BARRA signed up with Goodsearch in the fall of 2007. Every online search made through this engine yields us about a penny. In addition to the searches, online purchases made starting with Goodsearch's Goodshop result in a percentage of the purchase making its way back to BARRA.

To help BARRA with your searches and purchases, go to http://www.goodsearch.com. In the box labeled "Who do you Goodsearch for?" you need to enter our full name, "Buffalo Amateur Radio Repeater Association" and click the "verify" button. You should have to do this only the very first time you use the Goodsearch site from a particular computer. It's that easy! Now every search you make will make BARRA some money.

To make purchases, go to the Goodsearch page and click on the Goodshop banner below the search box. The most popular online retailers will appear on the next screen, but you can search for a particular vendor in the search box to the left of the screen. Almost every known online and brick-and-mortar retailer with an online presence has an arrangement with Goodsearch. There is no need to create a new account with your favorite retailer in order for BARRA to benefit from the shopping bonus, the only thing you need to do is to access the retailer from the Goodshop screen.

We thank everyone who has taken advantage of this service in the past year. The windfall from this arrangement has helped to keep BARRA in the black. W2EAS reported at the January board meeting that we finished a little over \$70 ahead for the calendar year from January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008. Keep those searches and purchases coming!

146.73 Leaves its Hotel Home

As reported in the previous issue of *The Link*, the hotel home of the K2ILH 146.73 repeater has been without electricity since the summer and thus the repeater has been off the air since that time. The trustees have been in contact with the hotel personnel the entire time and it has been clear for a while that the situation at the hotel is not going to change any time soon.



On Saturday, December

13th a hearty crew including W2EAS, K2ILH, WA2ZSJ, KA2CQQ and AB2UK, braving cold temperatures and ice, went to the site and removed the repeater equipment... no small task considering the repeater was located in the 10th floor elevator penthouse, and there's no electricity to operate the elevator! So, it had to be hauled down the stairs.

The antenna could not be removed that day -- see the above photo that KA2CQQ caught of W2EAS assessing the penthouse roof situation while WA2ZSJ steadied the ladder. The roof of the hotel and penthouse were glare ice which did not make for the safest of situations, and the removal of the antenna was postponed for an ice-less day on the roof.

The trustees are in negotiations for a new site for the 146.73 machine in the Niagara Falls area. More information as it is known.

More Hobby Highlights

This "Hobby Highlight" is about keeping good hearing in a noisy world. Excluding occupational risks, because you should take care of yourself on the job, I would like to raise your consciousness regarding wearing head phones. As amateurs we wear head phones while copying Morse code or other modes. It could also be possible that in your spare time you listen to the MP3 player. I found in the Amateur Radio News Line a reference to a Belgium web site that focused upon researchers who want "100 dB," one hundred decibels, to be the limit for people who are subject to intense sound for long periods of time. They conclude, that if a person remains in this environment for longer than five years permanent hearing damage can occur.

I see people of all ages using the MP3 players, and sometimes, if I am sitting close to someone listening to an MP3, I can hear the music coming from the tiny head phones. It should be our public service to warn people about the potential dangers occurring while listening to loud music. You can learn more about the Belgium report, and the demands France put on Apple Inc. to limit decibel ranges to one hundred. "Eighty nine" decibels is a dangerous level!
