It's Summer: Time for the BARRA Mobile Clinic and Picnic

BARRA's summertime get-together is almost here, the annual Mobile Clinic and Picnic at the Cole Road repeater site (directions at right) will take place Monday, July 16 starting around 5:30 PM. In the case of inclement weather, the rain date will be the following Monday, July 23. Dave, WA2TVT, has volunteered to be the local weather watcher for the day. Check out 146.91/444.00 for Dave's updates if the weather should prove to be "iffy" that day.

Born in an era of homebrewed and modified commercial two-way radios, the Mobile Clinic was a time to true-up drifty rigs and fine tune mobile antenna installations. While today's rigs aren't the drifty monstrosities of old, many "rice boxes" have poorly adjusted audio and/or deviation out of the box, and mobile antennas still need checking. Here's an opportunity to find out where your rig(s) stands. There will be commercial test equipment available to evaluate your equipment, however if you anticipate having to make adjustments, please bring your manuals, diddle sticks, etc. that you will need to work on your rig. Every rig has a different way of making adjustments, whether through an "old fashioned" pot on a circuit board or a service menu through the radio's controller -- or even an external computer -- and though our Tech Committee folks are good and can maybe lend hand, they can't possibly know every radio out there.

The picnic portion of the evening is bring your own. BARRA will provide grills and charcoal and a hot fire. Since some members may be coming directly from work, you may wish to bring a bit of extra food to share. Folks wishing to bring a dish to pass are most welcome to do so. Members are also reminded that the Cole Road site has no comfort facilities and are advised to plan ahead. Please also remember that the club's insurance liability policy forbids the consumption of alcohol on club property and at clubsponsored functions.



Map to Cole Road Repeater Site



TO W2EUP/R FROM BUFFALO:

Take the Thruway, I-90, westbound, to Exit 55, US Rt 219. Continue down US 219 to the Armor Duells Corners exit (after Mile Strip Rd).

At the top of the exit, turn right.

Proceed to intersection with Rt 277, and continue straight through.

Proceed along Rt. 240 about 2.1 mi. as it bends and twists its way along. You will come to a stop light, bear to the left at the light. Watch for a fire hall on your right not far past the stop light – Cole Rd is soon after!

After the fire hall, very shortly on your left is a white church. Almost immediately is a right turn, watch for yellow "T" sign – this is Cole Rd! Turn rt. onto Cole Rd.

Proceed along Cole Rd approx. 6.1 miles. The site is less than ¹/₂ mile from the intersection of Liebler and Wohlheiter Roads. Look for two 100 ft. towers on your left.

Turn left onto driveway just past a pond and small house. Go up small hill and watch for directions for where to park. Please DO NOT park on the paved driveway - it is the driveway of our neighbors in the back.

The Mobile Clinic will begin around 5:30 pm and continue until dark, or thereabouts. In case of "iffy" weather, listen to 146.91/444.00 for updates about local conditions in Boston.

[There is a seach function to locate local checkers for the different awards] It is important for applicants to get it right. It would be helpful if they read about it on the web site. Don't forget, once I sign the form you can't get it back. You must have the stamped, addressed envelope and payment to the ARRL so I can mail it."

Chet's Shack Update!



April, 2004: What a mess!

Paint has been applied. The disintegrating wood door has been replaced with a steel entry door. A new roof is forthcoming. It's a dramatic change.

Future plans for the shack include refurbishing the interior as an operations center where members can bring their rigs and operate from a splendid location. The BARRA Field Day operations have done just that the last couple of years and can attest to the excellent antenna location the Cole Road site is for any amateur band.

Here are two photographs taken by Ted, WA2HKS. The first is of the shack taken in April 2004 just before it was placed on the railroad tie foundation. The second was taken June 16, 2007 as the work crew tended to some of the last details. Note that that photo was taken almost exactly three years to the day after the foundation work.

While many members have lent their help and skills to the project, very special thanks go out to Bruce Barrows, WA2HVE, who has spearheaded the exterior renovation project, along with his dedicated assistant, Damon Edwards, AB2UK. Bruce and Damon have been present at every work party that's involved the exterior of Chet's Shack, and it was Bruce's tools that we used. Be sure to come out to the Mobile Clinic this month if for no other reason than to view "the new" Chet's Shack first-hand; it's a sight to behold.

As reported in the last issue of *The Link*, work on the Chet Riker, W2QMK, Memorial Operations Shack is nearing completion of the exterior renovations. This has been a project that has been underway since June of 2004 when work began in earnest.

The shack was originally constructed by the late Chet Riker, W2QMK, as his personal ham shack away from home. The frame of the shack is extremely sturdy, being discovered the hard way by the later work crews -- the studs are some hardwood, maple perhaps, that make nail driving a frustrating experience. After Chet's death the shack and the property on which it sits were acquired by BARRA from his family.

On June 12, 2004, the serious work on the shack began when a crew raised the building off the ground and installed railroad ties on which the building now sits. This got the building off the ground and away from damaging moisture. After that work began on the exterior. The original large double-hung windows, now rotting and falling apart, were replaced with smaller casement windows as a security measure. The exterior composite and now deteriorating siding was replaced with sheets of T-111 siding. The original open eaves were boxed in.

Next on the list is restoration to the interior. In preparation for this project BARRA is conducting a "GIVE A SHEET" program. Yes, here is a chance for you to "give a sheet" of plywood to be used as interior wall board. With your donation of \$20 per "Sheet" we will be able to install a 4-foot section of plywood as wallboard and insulation along with the wire and conduit for power, and a counter top surface for setting up rigs to operate.

A total of ten (10) sheets are needed to complete the walls. In addition four sheets will be needed as underlayment for the floor. Donations for the ceiling and floor tile have already been made.
