Hobby Highlights

I have a MFJ frequency standard unit. It can calibrate

my transceiver's frequencies within 25 to 100 kilohertz. It is comprised of a nice looking box, and a switch for 25, 50, and 100 kilohertz. I use it to measure my band frequencies. With that work accomplished, chances that I am outside a band when operating are highly unlikely. I can also calibrate my radio using CHU or WWV. Do you calibrate your radio frequencies often?



It is not a bad idea. Who wants to be cited by an official observer for using illegal frequencies? Listen to WWV on 10 MHz or CHU on 7.335 MHz. If your frequency is off then give the radio an adjustment. By the way, WWV and CHU are called utility stations. Utility stations have been developed for radio beacons, telemetry, RTTY, spying, aircraft and maritime communications, hurricane watching, satellite transmissions, emergency communications, and short wave reception of various kinds of geophysical data.

I found a couple of interesting web sites concerning utility stations. I hope you have a chance to use them. There are many lists indexed according to utility, country, and frequency. The lists can also be double clicked for more extensive explanations. The first one is: www.panix.com/clay/ham/ and the second is: www.ftp.funet.fi/pub/dx/text/utility/

Our amateur radio spectrum is included within the range of utility frequencies. You might be able to pick up many of these stations with a good ham receiver, or scanner. Commercial aircraft, military, and maritime systems can give you some insight into real time work. Tune up and have fun researching. 73.

A Kenwood TMD700A mobile APRS VHF/UHF dual band rig is available for sale. The rig is from the estate of Keith Laudenslager, K2DSN, and was kindly donated to BARRA by his XYL. The rig is very good condition and was used only a short time by Keith.

The D700 has built-in APRS and packet TNC capabilities requiring only an external GPS receiver with a standard NMEA interface to enable the user to become a mobile APRS unit.

The rig is being offered to BARRA club members first and as the rig is nearly new an offer in accordance with that is ex-


