BARRA Annual Meeting is This Month, Club's Financial Situation to be Discussed

BARRA's by-laws state that the annual meeting of the corporation should take place each October for the purpose of hearing financial reports and electing board members. We will, of course, do both!

At last month's general membership meeting nominations were taken from the floor for candidates for the expiring terms of Nelson Oldfield, WA2ZSJ, and Doug Alderdice, KA2WFT. The incumbents were nominated and they accepted their respective nominations. Other nominations were asked for but not received and there was a motion from the floor to close the nominations. The secretary will cast one ballot at the October Annual Meeting to re-elect our nominated candidates.

The more serious side to the evening will be the discussion of the club's financial status. A summary sheet for the fiscal year appears inside this issue on page 5.

As many may know, we lost our tenant at the Cole Road site, WNGS-TV, this past spring. WNGS has entered into a new agreement with WKBW-TV and is no longer in need of our facility, which they had used to get their off-air signal to the cable companies. The loss of this tenant means a \$1700 per year loss to the club. As you can see on the year-end report, the club lost nearly \$700 this year -- and we were without WNGS's rent for only part of our fiscal year! This is an extremely dire situation in which we find ourselves.

Some recent cost cutting moves have been implemented, namely the autopatch was turned off, dues were raised, and members who wish a paper copy of the newsletter underwrite that. It is a good start, but we have some significant costs that cannot be changed: liability insurance, utility expense at Cole Road, and property taxes for the Cole Road property.

An oft-discussed topic is the club applying for 501(c)3 status. Our treasurer has been looking into this over the past few years. While at the face of it 501(c)3 would appear to be a saving grace, there are some harsh realities associated with it. The first one is that significant costs will be incurred in the application process, primarily for counsel from an attorney experienced in 501(c)3 applications. There are, however, absolutely no guarantees that once applied for, it will be granted.

The second "gotcha" to 501(c)3 status is that even if granted, the Town of Boston would not and does not have to automatically grant property tax free status to us. That would be another situation to apply for, providing 501(c)3 status was granted.

A third aspect to the 501(c)3 status is that to even be considered "worthy" of applying for the status, we need to have a major educational component to our operations. At first look, this would appear to be an easy one: we can run license classes. However, considering we have difficulty getting enough members to participate in various club activities like the soccer tournament communications and the ongoing renovation operation to Chet's Shack, it would seem optimistic at best that we could pull together enough folks to teach licensing classes at the present time.

Another concern with 501(c)3 status, albeit not as major as the financial uncertainties above, is that we would have to revamp our membership structure as 501(c)3 organizations are not allowed to have multi-level memberships like our voting and nonvoting status.

In short, we could end up spending a lot of money and effort to end up at exactly the same point we are at now, only with an even smaller treasury due to the costs associated with the application process for official 501(c)3 status.

A more practical way to seeing our way to a blacker bottom line is to further reduce costs wherever possible, and to increase membership. We all probably have at least one ham friend who is not a BARRA member but uses our machines. We need to be more diligent in inviting our ham friends to become members and to participate in our activities. A membership application is always available on the club's web site, barra.hamgate.net.

The Tech Net has been somewhat of a boon to the membership. Our popular Wednesday night offering has resulted in several new members and the Friday night Tech Committee meetings are lately seeing equal or better attendance than the general meetings! We need more activities like the Tech Net that bring out the prospective members.

As we head into our 40th year as a club, we are looking good, but we could be better. Come out to the Annual Meeting on Monday, October 16, and bring your ideas.

BARRA Bowling?

To that end of coming up with some club activities to generate some interest and participation, how about something non ham radio? Board member Dave Halik, W2ZZA, is floating the idea of a BARRA bowling activity. It's something fun that almost everyone can do and is a great fellowship opportunity as well.
