N5XU is a club station call sign for the University of Texas at Austin. You can find it at http://n5xu.ece.utexas.edu It has many links, stories, and interesting tools for the shack. In particular I enjoyed the RF safety calculator. It is also at http://n5xu.ece.utexas.edu/rfsafety/ It automatically calculates values for effective radiated



power, frequency, gain, and ground reflection. The program will tell you if you are in compliance!

If you are interested in computer programming access the Basic or C languages. The ARRL RF safety committee link is in here too. KM2L among others can be located; pictures and short biographies included. The club has some exciting DX stories from their alumni. I found one story about two amateurs who operated near Antarctica. After researching N5XU I felt incomplete; then again, not so! I searched for my own call sign. I was surprised, I am on the net! I found KG2OR listed for Straight Key Night, and some contests. I tried KM2L and it was like striking oil. He is cross referenced in a number of sites. Try your own call, you might be a footnote.

CQ Satellite - CQ QSL Cards!

April 2003 – I get a new identity...KC2LGK. You may ask why? I Did. I guess it's because my "OM" Dave W2ZZA wanted me to, or shall I say challenged me to. I'm always up for a challenge.

After that I still really didn't know why. OK, to talk to Dave during drive time and of course a few others along the way. I'm not much of a conversationalist and I was always told not to talk to strangers. With that being said, I'm not finding this hobby very exciting.

August 2003, I started working UO-14. Ted, WA2HKS, had the downlink of UO-14 on the linked BARRA repeater system ("Spacelink") and the uplink was on 2 meters. Satellite Sandy is born and this is getting exciting.

Bruce Paige, KK5DO, in Alief, TX and Randolph Kohlwey, N7SFI, in Park City, UT were my first two satellite contacts. Not bad for my first attempt. I couldn't believe how hard it was to get my ears tuned in to be able to copy any one person.

So now that I made some contacts I have to send out QSL cards. Better yet I start getting QSL cards! Richard, N1ASA, from Bowling Green, KY was the first QSL card I got.

Unfortunately 10 days after I

started working UO-14 was the last time I worked UO-14. Albert, K4VHV, in Elizabeth City, NC was my last QSO on UO-14 on August 12, 2003. Of course I didn't know it at the time, no one did, UO-14 was no longer working.

Well, that was fun while it lasted. You just never knew who you would contact. I managed to talk to several Canadians, Emily, W0EC, in California (woo hoo, another woman!), Leo, W7JPI, in Arizona who I still talk to on AO-51 and SO-50, Angel, WP3GW, in Trujillo Alto, Puerto Rico and even WA2HKS in West Seneca.

As fast and furious as my satellite contacts started, they came to an abrupt end.

I bugged Dave constantly to get me back on the air with the birds. We sold one of our Icom 718s and we bought an Icom 821.

It was now Dave's job to get me the rest of the parts to get me on the satellites. It wasn't until November 2006 that I started working AO-51 & SO-50. I currently have 437 satellite contacts and 42 States.

My evenings and weekends consist of checking the schedules and planning activities around the birds. I wouldn't want to miss a good pass, you know? Just the other day breakfast had to wait for an AO-51 pass. Timing is everything, oh my, this girl is hooked.

Some of the more memorable contacts: Allen, N5AFV, from Houston, TX. I've worked him in five different grid squares. He was on a cruise this year in the Gulf of Mexico and each pass was a different square. I remember wondering where he would be next. I also worked Allen in Belize City, Belize. Color me stupid but I had

no idea where Belize was or that it even existed. It's in grid square EK57 if you were wondering.


Then there is Eduardo, XE2YW, in Zacatecas, Mexico...boy was he hard to understand. Julio, TG9GJG, in Guatemala City, Guatemala. My furthest contact of 2282.7 miles was with Bernardo, he had a special prefix for the 75th Anniversary of FMRE 6I2HWB/XE2HWB. He's in La Paz B.C.S. Mexico (DL44).



Memorable of late is W3PM, Gene in GN13 aboard the Queen Mary 2. What's even better was his QSL card: a picture of the Queen Mary 2

along with a picture of him on board in his tuxedo with HT and 70cm eggbeater in hand.

The last few weeks I've been hurrying home to see what's in the mail box. Recently I caught up on sending QSL cards and I am hoping to get some back in return. Sending and receiving QSL cards is something I look forward to.



Will there be a card today? Where will it be from? I open the mail with a smile...here's one from Carolyn in Ohio. Oh my, she has a sewing machine on hers! Ham radio: it's not just for guys! But don't worry men, of all my contacts only four of


them were women.
