Hobby Highlights

I have often wanted to transmit music on the ham band, but rules prohibit it; so I do not. This has not dissuaded artists to create scores for ham radio. One band has done a good job in the field of ham radio and music, "The Ham Band." The core of the band is in Denmark, near Aarhus, and in the 1990s they used musicians from Nashville



TN. Andrew Huddleston, OZ1XJ, and his wife Lissa made the CD. I recently found some ARRL news and other websites promoting it. This Hobby Highlights is information about "Seek You." In a sample video I saw Andrew and his wife standing on a Yagi tower and singing a song!

Three websites contain details about the Huddleston's venture. First, http://www.hamtestonline.com promotes study guides for amateur radio exam testing, and at the bottom of the home page there is a button for "The Ham Band." In this part you will find the video and a number of sample songs. Another web site is, http://www.arrl.org/news/stories/2004/03/19/2/?nc=1 which describes in 3/19/2004 their history. Not only did club OZ5E, including OZ1XJ, his friend Jan, OZ1ADL, gather over three million points in a "CQ WW SSB Contest," but Andrew and his wife Lissa developed a variety of music and productions. Sometimes they are called to perform at Ham socials.

The next site is http://www.hamband.com. According to this site the music video comprises French Mussett, Viennese Waltz and German Oompah. The "Seek You" video which I saw is Country/Western. Their songs include topics such as: grey line, contests, on-air operation, and Morse code. Top hats, gowns, and champagne are used as props in this video located through the hamtestonline site.

In conclusion, while much of what we do and who we are is performed in the ham shack; I find it fascinating where we use music, pins, decals, ham conventions, flea markets, awards, books, and articles. It is continuously promoting the hobby. This process gives us an identity consistent with culture. Ham radio becomes a way of life. It is not only a medium of communication; it causes us to diversify production and consume ham radio goods. This begins after the rule: Do not transmit music on ham bands.
