AO-27 Satellite News

AMSAT News

AO-27 was returned to analog Amateur use on the first North American daylight pass on Saturday September 9, 2000. The satellite is functioning as an FM voice repeater on the following frequencies:

Uplink: 145.850 MHz Downlink: 436.797 MHz

The current TEMPR states are as follows:

TEPR 4: 36 TEPR 5: 72

Periodically, over the next several months, the analog repeater will be turned off for a few days at a time to enable controllers the opportunity to gather Whole Orbital Data and verify the health of the satellite.

VHF Academy 2000 Rochester, NY

The Rochester VHF Group is sponsoring a one-day immersion into the world of VHF and above operation. Saturday, November 11, 2000 is the date for VHF Academy 2000. Spend the day at The Academy learning about VHF Propagation, Satellite Operation and VHF Contesting Strategies. Two more sessions on that day will deal with a technical treatment of equipment performance measurement and a hands-on lab in which Cadets will be able to actually build their own high-performance Rover antenna!

The day will begin at 8:30 am with a continental breakfast and end at 3:00 pm. By signing up early, The Rochester VHF Group will provide a full tuition (no cost to attend!). Additionally, a lunch will be provided (also at no cost). By signing-in at all five sessions throughout the day, you will also qualify for a one-year free membership in the Rochester VHF Group, with members-only access to their website (where you will be able to download the latest issues of The VHF Journal, the club newsletter).

Free VHF Academy attendance is open to any person, licensed or unlicensed, that is presently not a member of the Rochester VHF Group and who signs-up prior to November 5th. The academy will be held in the Rochester suburb of Greece, New York and is easily accessible by I-390. More detail to come.

Pumpkin Patrol 2000 Needs Volunteers

The purpose of this event is to help the New York State Police on Halloween Night by watching over bridges along some of our major highways. The assistance rendered will be in the form of observation and subsequent notification of law enforcement authorities in the case of any trouble. We run this event through a controlled net on Halloween evening. The bridge assignments are on a first-call, first-get basis. What I mean by this is if you would like a specific bridge call me ASAP. We have plenty of bridges out there to watch over to assure a safe Halloween evening for all.

This year the pumpkin patrol will be working with and is sponsored by ARES. The Amateur Radio Emergency Service, ARES, is a national public service organization coordinated by the American Radio Relay League. It consists of licensed Amateur Radio Operators who have voluntarily registered their qualifications and equipment to provide emergency communications for public service events as needed.

You DO NOT have to be an ARES member or belong to any clubs to help out with the pumpkin patrol. The pumpkin patrol is an amateur radio event and is open to ALL amateurs who are willing to lend a hand. All you need to help is a 2-meter rig with 2 meter privileges and a car would be helpful although not necessary (depending on the weather that evening). We also have people helping out from their homes by monitoring on scanners and other radios.

There will be an organizational meeting for the pumpkin patrol at the October ARES meeting and will feature guests from the NY State Police. This meeting will be held Monday, Oct. 9th at 7:00 PM at the Erie County Fire Training Academy on Broadway Avenue, just east of Union Road, and behind the Cheektowaga police station. I will also be at this meeting to talk to the people and register them at this time if they like.
